# MIDWEST SENIDR CLASSIC 

November 4, 2012

The MSC is a bowling venue for fifty and older players (male or female) to compete in against each other.
You must be at least 50 on the day of the tournament.
We have 12 events per year, June through May.
Entry fee is $\$ 90$ for members, $\$ 100$ for nonmembers, membership is $\$ 45$ per season.

Payout is 1 for 2, same day.
Format is 8 match gms, with the $8^{\text {th }}$ game
being a position round. This is followed by a stepladder.
When there are 8 or more SS or, if there are 6 or more SDS, one must be in the ladder; and if there are 4 or more ROGs, one must be in the ladder.
There must be at least one player over 59 in the ladder, no matter anything else.

Age Classifications
50 through 58 is a regular
59 through 64 is a super senior(ss)
65 through 69 is a super duper(sds)
70 and older is a real old guy(rog)
Payout is guaranteed 1 for 2 for ss, sds and rogs.
The year end tournament has added money to each payout position.
To qualify for the year end event, you must be a member and have played at least 4 tournaments in the 2012-13 season.

For every 20 bowlers, there will be a non casher high game
Your age determines your classification. You do not have the option of moving into another age bracket.

Any questions related to payout and scoring will be left to the discretion of the Director. Each MSC tournament is certified by the USBC

Jeff Baker won his first MSC title by defeating qualifying leader, Bruce Smith. Baker struck on 7 of his last 9 shots to put the game away. Jeff qualified second and led in scratch pin fall with 1992, an average of 240 for the 8 games. He was the only player to knock down at least 1900 pins. To get to the title game, he defeated Dave Lutz in the semi final game in a close match.

Smith was looking for his $4^{\text {th }}$ title. Bruce now holds the record for career runner up finishes. This was his twelfth $2^{\text {nd }}$ place finish. Bruce also has 15 other top 5 finishes. Bruce was the qualifying leader. The title game was even through 6 frames.

Dave Lutz finished third. In the semi final, Lutz needed a double in the $10^{\text {th }}$ to advance. He buried the $1^{\text {st }}$ for a strike and buried the $2^{\text {nd }}$, only to see a pin standing, a really tough break. Nevertheless, a very good tourney for Lutz. He hasn't played many MSCs and has yet to win. But, if he continues to play these tourneys, that $1^{\text {st }}$ title is inevitable.
Fourth went to Tom Korth, looking for his $9^{\text {th }}$ title. He is currently in $4^{\text {th }}$ on the career title list with 8 . Look for number 9 to come soon. In this event, he qualified in $5^{\text {th }}$. He defeated 2 foes in the $1^{\text {st }}$ ladder game to advance. In the $2^{\text {nd }}$ ladder game against Ken Schrapp, he needed to strike out in the $10^{\text {th }}$ to tie. He did that and then in the $9^{\text {th }} \boldsymbol{\&} \mathbf{1 0}^{\text {th }}$ frame added $\mathbf{4}$ more strikes to advance to meet Lutz.

Ken Schrapp had his highest finish to date. He was one spare short of advancing in the ladder. Schrapp had 8200 games in qualifying and qualified in $4^{\text {th }}$. Look for this guy to be in future ladders.

Craig Schiffler finished in $6^{\text {th }}$. With this finish, he is the current leader in the POY points race. He has been very consistent to date. He is in the top 5 of each stat category. Look for him to win a title soon.

And, the $7^{\text {th }}$ ladder player was Mike Schmid, seeded as the ROG. Mike is looking for his $4^{\text {th }}$ MSC title.

The board has agreed to accept him as the new Director.
Doug has a history in bowling: until he incurred a wrist injury, he was a very good scratch player; he is a collector of bowling historical items. His collection is nothing less than phenomenal.

He probably won't need any help, but I will be available to assist him if he needs help.

When John Dorek retired from the MSC, I volunteered to be the interim director. I didn't think $I$ would be in that position almost 5 years later. In short, I enjoyed the experience and learned a few things along the way.
But I always enjoyed playing in these tournaments and always looked forward to playing these again. So, when Doug offered, I encouraged him to do this.

Thanks for allowing me to do this!!!!!! Several changes have been introduced for this season.
1)As you know, a high game out of the money was awarded $\$ 40$ for every 13 entries. Because our lineage to the house increased to $\$ 13$ per entry, the high game will be $\$ 40$ for every 20 entries.
2) In an attempt to keep 65 and older players from retiring from competition, the former ratio of $8: 1$ for stepladder seeding has been revised. The new ratio is: $\mathrm{SDS}=1$ for $6 ; \mathrm{ROG}=1$ for 4.The ratio for SS remains at 1 for 8 . I would like to emphasize the impact older players have on the MSC. In a typical tournament, for every 2 entries, they put $\$ 140$ into the prize fund and usually take out $\$ 90$. That leaves $\$ 50$ for the field.
